Japan America Society 2011 Annual Report

The Japan-America Society of Saint Louis (JAS) was founded in 1967 with the mission to promote the exchange and understanding between the people of Japan and the United States. The Society is a 501(c) (3) non-profit, non-partisan, educational and cultural organization. It offers information about Japan and provides variety of public education programs about Japan and U.S.-Japan relations. It also serves as an umbrella organizations involving the Japanese Activities Committee (Dave Lowry, Chair), Japan America Society Women's Association (Aya Kawasaki, President; Dolores Krapfl, President Elect) and Seinen-kai [Association of Young Men and Women] (Steve Masaki, President). The Society also supports the St. Louis Japanese Language School for Children in St. Louis.

The leadership for the Society is provided by the board of directors, including 22 elected members, and six elected officers. All of the work of the Society is done by volunteers. The Office of International Studies and Programs at University of Missouri-St. Louis (Dr. Joel Glassman, ISP Director & Associate Provost of Academic Affairs at UMSL) provides office space and operational support.

The Japan America Society of St. Louis receives and answers 150 inquiries in a given year on anything and everything about Japan. In addition, the Society receives requests for lectures and demonstrations from local libraries, schools and other organizations in the St. Louis region. The Society annually provides its members and general public a dozen educational and social programs.

Our largest community engagement is Annual Japanese Festival, held at the Missouri Botanical Garden (MBG). The Japanese Activities Committee of the Japan America Society of St. Louis coordinates production of the festival events. The festival originated in the 1960s when the first and second generation Japanese Americans and Japanese residing in the St. Louis area produced the festival every year. They raised seed money for construction of a Japanese garden in St. Louis and approached Dr. Peter Raven, then MBG President. The result of these efforts led to the dedication of the Japanese Garden, Seiwa-en (meaning the garden of harmony and peace) on a 14 acres land in 1977. Since then the Society and MBG have developed a unique partnership in hosting the annual Japanese festival. The Japanese Activity Committee works with all Japanelated organizations in St. Louis in bringing authentic Japanese programs and festival events to the community. The festival has become one of the largest and oldest Japanese Festivals in North America. Each year, 30,000 to 50,000 people come and enjoyed the festival.

The Japan America Society of St. Louis is also unique with its close relations with the International Studies and Programs (ISP) and the Shibusawa-Arai Endowed Professorship of Japanese Studies at UMSL. In 1999, Mr. Seigo Arai, businessman and friend of the Japan America Society of St. Louis, made a gift (\$550,000) to UMSL to

establish the Ei'ichi Shibusawa-Seigo Arai Professorship in Japanese Studies. Together with ISP and Shibusawa-Arai Japanese Professorship at UMSL, Japan America Society of St. Louis provides lectures and events about Japan. Currently, the position is held by Dr. Laura Miller, a Professor of Anthropology. Her research focuses on Japanese culture, language and gender, and linguistic anthropology.

In response to the mega disaster that struck Japan on March 11, the Society organized the Japan Earthquake and Tsunami Relief Fund and collected \$13, 2170.01. Following the JAS Board resolution of April 2011, the collected funds were sent to Japan Society of New York in October 2011, which in turn dispersed collected donations directly to NPOs in Japan.
